A STRIKING POSE "Stories: Portraits," a group show at Eleven Rivington, aims to challenge the traditional genre. The predominantly international collection of artists, many of whom are exhibiting for the first time in a New York gallery, paint friends, lovers, and relatives both from life and from found images and family photographs. The Swedish-born artist **Ylva Ogland**'s photo-realistic oil paintings depict her as a child in domestic settings: In "Ylva and Her Father" (2008), above, the artist's father cradles her in his lap while smoking a cigarette; an artwork hangs on a wall in the background. *Through Friday, August 22, July: Wednesday-Sunday, noon-6 p.m., August: Monday-Friday, 11 a.m.-5 p.m., Eleven Rivington, 11 Rivington St., between Bowery and Chrystie Street, 212-982-1930, free.*
